

## CO-CURRICULAR AND INTERSCHOLASTIC PROGRAMS

- I. Definitions.
  - A. Academic eligibility period means the period of time during which a student may participate in interscholastic athletics and co-curricular activities. Academic eligibility periods are determined by the date of issuance of report cards reflecting grades earned during the semester:
  - B. Academic ineligibility is the consequence that occurs when a student fails to meet academic eligibility standards at the end of an academic probation period or academic eligibility period.
  - C. Academic ineligibility period is the period of time during which a student is ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletic practices, interscholastic athletic contests, or co-curricular activities, contests or performances.
  - D. Interscholastic athletics are school approved, individual or team interscholastic athletic contests between two or more schools under the rules and regulations of the South Dakota High School Activities Association.
  - E. Co-curricular activities are school approved non-interscholastic athletic activities for which a student does not receive a letter grade and which normally occur outside of the regular instructional day. Co-curricular activities such as Band, Chorus, Orchestra and Debate where the student does receive a letter grade are included to the extent that the co-curricular activity practices, performs or participates outside of the regular instructional day under the rules and regulations of the South Dakota High School Activities Association. This includes state and school elected and/or appointed officers of the student government.
